Steps on the Journey

Easter is over — or is it? We have celebrated the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. We have seen the lilies bloom. The cross is empty. The tomb is open. Now it is over.

Or is it just beginning? The new life that we experience at Easter is not a one-time event. But is something that happens over and over again. We hear the story and it becomes fresh for us because of who we are and what we have become since last we heard it.

Each of the gospel writers tells us the resurrection story and the aftermath a little differently. They all agree on certain things. Jesus was raised from the dead. The first people to experience the resurrection were women coming to care for the body of their leader, their teacher, their friend. After that each gospel writer tells the story differently. Is it because they forgot to compare notes? Is it because they were talking to different groups of people? Or is it because the story is so big and speaks to each person differently so that we need all the stories to hear the truth.

Each of us reads the stories through our own eyes and our own experiences and we hear the story a little differently, a little more fully. Our own understanding of resurrection grows with each day.

Resurrection becomes a way of life; a life that no longer lives in despair but now lives in hope, a life that no longer is hopeless but is now hopeful, a life that is no longer full of sorrow but is now filled with joy.

Resurrection sees an empty cross and tomb and invites us to celebrate Easter every day. There is a song that says "every morning is Easter morning from now on. Every day's resurrection day, the past is over and gone!"

Is Easter over for you or has it just begun?

Your gifts change the world: Clean layettes for newborns

In the shadow of a shuttered mining operation in western Uganda, one thousand newborn babies are going home "in style," beginning their lives with dignity, thanks to the layette kits their mothers received from UM Committee on Relief and the American Foundation for Children with AIDS (AFCA). Gifts on One Great Hour of Sharing Sunday pays for the overhead for UMCOR. "In Uganda, mothers face a lot of challenges," said Musoki Hellen, who gave birth to her first child, a son, a week before Christmas at Kilembe Mines Hospital (KMH), where the kits were distributed. Those challenges, she said, include unemployment, child neglect by the father, and domestic violence. "It is pleasing to know that there are people out there who feel the plight of women; that it has touched their hearts to share God's blessings with those in need," she said. For many new mothers at the hospital, which is located on the premises of Kilembe Mines. Ltd., a copper mine that ceased operations 30 years ago, the kits' contents—onesies, sleeping outfits, blankets, diapers, and other necessities—-are simply out of reach. "The mothers can leave the hospital with their babies dressed warmly and well no matter how poor they might be. It doesn't matter if they live in a shack or under a tree, their babies are warm and wearing new outfits, with no tears or stains, and the women are proud," said Tanya Weaver, executive director of AFCA. "Dignity is huge when you don't have much else to hold onto." The layette kits, like the UMCOR health kits, school kits, birthing kits, bedding kits, sewing kits, and cleaning buckets, are all donated and assembled by volunteers working in their UM congregations and at any of the seven member depots of the UMCOR Relief-supply network. "And, of course, the outfits will be used for future siblings as these children outgrow them," Weaver said.

Apportionments also provide the skill-building webinars, church vitality resources, Christian camps and retreats that draw young people to God, and ministry support and connections mentioned above.

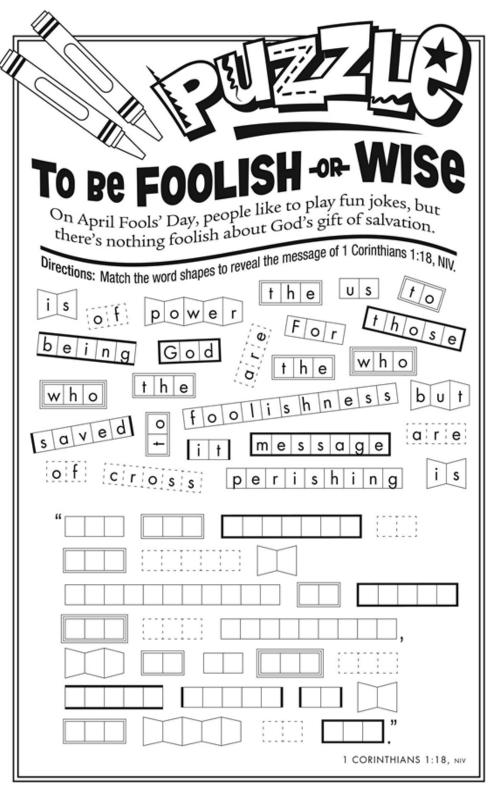

Answer: "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."



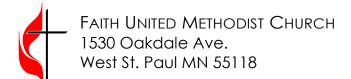
Believing in the message of the cross makes you wise. This treat is a great reminder to be wise in God's ways.

What you need:

- Slice of whole wheat bread
- Circle cookie cutter (or jar lid)
- Butter knife
- Nut butter (peanut, hazelnut, etc.)
- Toasted oat cereal
- 2 banana slices
- 1 cashew
- 2 chocolate chips

What you do:

- 1. Cut a circle from the bread to be the owl's head. Then cut out a small semi-circle atop that bread circle to resemble pointy ears.
- 2. With a knife, spread the nut butter on the bread.
- 3. Place cereal along the top of head, from ear to ear.
- 4. Place banana slices for eyes.
- 5. Dip the chocolate chips in nut butter and place them in the middle of the banana slices.
- 6. Place a cashew for the nose between the bananas.

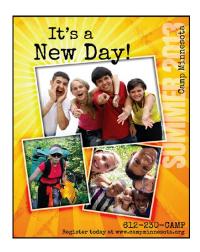
