And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. 2 Corinthians 9:8



The world can be divided into people who see the glass half full and those who see it half empty. At any given time most of us are aware of both blessings and burdens, opportunities and problems, joys and sorrows. The burdens, problems, and sorrows generally need to be faced, but it can become easy for us to lose sight of the blessings, opportunities, and joys that are also present.

In comparison to most of the world, those of us in North America enjoy a high level of affluence. The media, however, keep telling us that there are those who have more elegant homes, more luxurious cars, finer clothes, and more exotic vacation destinations. It's easy to become jealous of others and to aspire to a more expensive lifestyle than we can currently afford. While we can't escape those messages, we need to be careful that they do not keep us from recognizing the material blessings we already have.

Most who read these words not only have shelter but live in comfortable homes. We have good food to eat, medical and dental care when we need it, comfortable transportation for work and recreation, and the potential to save or invest if we manage wisely.

As the Scripture text reminds us, God is the source of material wealth and gives us the ability to share those material blessings with others. Our motivation for giving to the church and to other important causes should not be duty or obligation but thankfulness for what God gives. A Spirituality and Giving Project survey of church members around North America revealed that over 75% would like to give more than they currently do.

This is a good time to think about the difference that your giving can make in the life of the church and of those the church serves.

Prayer: Loving God, thank you for the abundance of your blessings. Help us to give out of thankful hearts, recognizing all that you make possible for our lives. Amen.

good friend's husband was diagnosed with a **1** life-threatening illness. Together they went through two months of unknowns, hospitalization, and surgeries. Later, she reflected on that time and said, "Not once during those months was I afraid. I was so grateful for all the people who were helping in so many ways. And I found that I could not be grateful and fearful at the same time."

Gratitude and its close cousin, joy, result from action, not just feeling. Active joyfulness brings with it an awareness of who we are and an acknowledgment that all we have are gifts from a generous, loving God. We search for signs of the good in the people and situations around us. We work to give up selfish perspectives and join more closely in the movements of God in the world.

Living from the perspective of gratitude and joy, our hearts remain open to the Spirit's influence; we stay connected to God's guidance. Being grateful for God's good in our lives displaces our fears and dissatisfactions and replaces them with God's presence.

Loving God, help me be the face of joy to someone who might be struggling today. If I am facing struggles of my own, gently guide my thoughts toward gratitude, that I may rejoice always in you. Amen.

- 2. Say a grace before each meal. Also say a grace before you engage in a new activity.
- 3. Each time you pick up the phone, receive or send a text, or look at an email or letter, give thanks for that person.
- 4. If you are struggling with fear, sadness, or hopelessness, stop what you are doing and jot down a list of 5 things for which you are grateful.
- 5. Say a prayer of thanks at the end of the day.

Make your voice heard; MN Conference requests input for feasibility study

The Minnesota Conference of the United Methodist Church recently launched a feasibility study, and United Methodists across the state are being asked to participate. The study will assess the conference's readiness for a congregational development capital campaign to seed new faith communities across the state and help existing congregations like ours grow in strength, spirituality, and community impact. Please visit the home page of the conference website (www.minnesotaumc.org) and click on "Feasibility Study" to learn more about the efforts underway and provide input through a brief online questionnaire. All responses submitted through the questionnaire are confidential and go directly to the consulting firm that's leading the conference through the feasibility study process.

Your feedback is important and will be used to formulate objectives and plans. Many of our church leaders are participating in the feasibility study. A report on the findings will be presented at the 2014 annual conference session.

Old Salem Update

As you know, last month Old Salem Shrine was vandalized. Since then, we have had a great response from the community with offers to help. Some donations have been received at Vermillion State Bank, as well as in the mail to Bart and me. We continue to receive phone calls. he Pioneer Press and the Southwest Re-

view are forwarding phone numbers and emails from folks offering to help as well. The Town Square TV was out last Tuesday and will be airing our story beginning this Thursday with a request for help also.

I have the necessary bids and information ready for submitting the claim to the insurance company. However, the Police Department has not yet released their report. I talked with the investigator this morning. He has contacted all pawn shops, scrap yards, local churches, and neighboring cities in hopes that it may lead to information identifying the culprits. He would like to wait a little while longer before releasing his report.

The Bierstube has donated \$1,000 worth of gift cards for us to sell and retain the money. They are \$10 gift cards; quite easy to sell for \$10. If you would like a supply, just let me know and we'll arrange to get them to you.

It is my hope that we are still able to hold our Epiphany Service on January 5th. Please let me know if you have questions or concerns.



Brighten your dinner table with these festive candle holders.


What you need:
