Steps on the Journey

It is October and at this time each year Faith collects an anniversary offering as a way of remembering where we have come from and to thank God for the blessings we have received. It is a reminder from where we have come from and how we are invited to reach out beyond ourselves again.

Since 2011 the anniversary offering has gone to support the capital campaign for Neighbors' Inc's new building. The new building was necessary for Neighbor's to continue to be in ministry to the northern Dakota County area. It is one of the joint ministries we do with other churches, individuals and businesses in the area. All of the churches in the area were asked to make a pledge for the capital campaign. The leadership of Faith took this request very seriously and at the congregational meeting in January, 2011 recommended we financially support the capital campaign. We, as a congregation decided that our pledge would be \$9,000 paid over 3 to 5 years. We were one of the few churches in the community to make a pledge. We have raised about half of our pledge. It would be wonderful to be able to pay off our pledge this year.

You might ask what difference Neighbor's makes in our community. In October, 2010 before moving, Neighbor's was able to help 254 families with groceries. In October 2012 one year

after the move 445 families were assisted. In July, 2013 (the last month there is statistics available) 474 families were aided.

The need continues and the new building makes being of assistance easier. There is space for the various programs, staff can have offices not the corners of hallways and people can be helped with dignity and privacy.

Neighbor's will continue to be a ministry outreach focus of Faith Church. We will continue to collect food, coats, school supplies, money. We will continue to have members of the congregation volunteer there.

We will remember that once upon a time a small group of people listened to God's voice and began a congregation that became Faith United Methodist Church. Today will continue to listen to God's voice and reach beyond our walls to help all of God's children have enough to eat and a place that treats them with respect and dignity in their difficult times.

Day of Service and Potluck —October 13

On Sunday, October 13 we will have our next day of service and potluck. On that Sunday we will be tying quilts for a battered women's shelter, making cards for mobile meals, filling shoeboxes for "Shoebox Christmas" in the Dakotas and making birthing, health and school kits.

We need your help to make this work. Between now and the 13th please bring any of the following items to church: for the kits - receiving blankets (28x28 or 32x32), small soap (1-2 oz.), gallon sealable bags, hand towel (15x25 to 17x27), wash cloth, comb, metal nail clipper or file, hand soap (3 oz or larger), toothbrush, bandages, blunt scissors (not plastic), pads of paper, pencil sharpener, 30 centimeter ruler, pencils and crayons (24 count). Bring these items to the church and leave either by the money pot or outside Pastor Gail's office.

Also this year we will be participating in Shoebox Christmas for the Children of the Harvest/Spirit Lake Ministry in the Dakotas. This ministry works with Native Americans on the 5 reservations (Pine Ridge, Rosebud, Enemy Swim School in South Dakota and Spirit Lake and Turtle Mountain in North Dakota). To start, wrap the bottom and top of a cardboard or plastic shoebox separately, this allows volunteers to insert the story of Jesus' birth. Ask children in your life what they would like for Christmas. Add one of their suggestions, a few small gifts, candy, a winter hat, mittens or scarf. Place a rubber band around the closed box, write the child's age group and gender on the box top using the following categories: Toddler, 3-5, 6-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 and up. If you need a box, pick one up outside Pastor Gail's office. If you prefer, just bring items and we will assemble boxes on the 13th.

Praying for the World

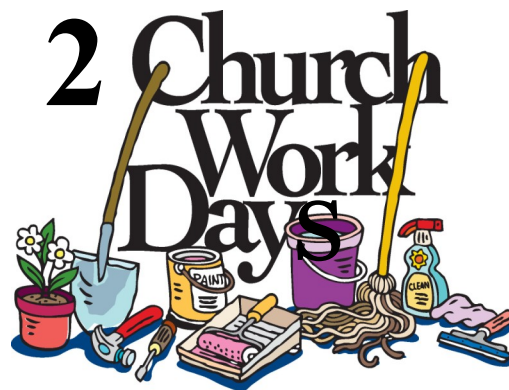

1. Relax with a few deep breaths, using the rhythm of your breathing to center your awareness here, now, in the present moment.
2. Intentionally open yourself to the flow of the Spirit of God through your heart, mind, and body. Many people use the image of breathing the Breath of Life or sitting surrounded by the Light of God.
3. Envision the entire planet before you, as we have all seen it through the eyes of the astronauts. You may choose to be realistic in your envisioning, using all your senses to imagine the earth's dappled blue oceans, rust-red-green continents, dazzling polar ice caps, and swirling cloud formations. Or you may prefer to see the whole planet more symbolically— as a political map, for instance, or by imagining differing populations of flora, fauna, and people.
4. Envision the whole planet being bathed in a visual symbol of God's compassionate love for all creatures—a great Light that streams from above or with a strong but gentle Wind that bathes, moves, cleanses, nourishes, and heals. Let this Light or Wind envelop you also and join your own caring compassion with the flow of the Spirit's intercession for the world.
5. Affirm the living "communion of saints" who care, pray, and work for the good of the world by imagining dots of light appearing like small stars all over the world. Let these lights connect into a web of light that girdles the globe, reminding you that your prayer joins a tide of prayer already happening.
6. You may wish to "zoom in" on particular situations or locations, moving imaginatively into a place where there is need or trouble. In each case, envision the difficulty sufficiently to be in touch with it but let your focus be on the Spirit, Light, or Wind that is moving through the situation
7. Conclude with the vision of the planet from space and a short verbal affirmation of your intention that "God's will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Offer the prayer with all its images and feelings to God as you understand God. Let it go into the divine Compassion.

Celebrating God's Blessings

Handling money is a creative act, a work of art. While we intend something beautiful, we always risk creating disaster instead. Either way, we set economic activity in motion. We hold this godlike thing in our hands. In choosing our intentions for money—whether good or bad—we must first decide whether or not money will rule us (Mark Vincent, *A Christian View of Money*, Herald Press, Scottsdale, 1999, p. 23).

Money has power. Money can be used to purchase weapons of destruction or feed the hungry, to build missiles or a homeless shelter. Our decisions about money can put us deeply into debt, making us slaves to monthly bills and obligations. Our decisions about money can also liberate us, enabling us to find pleasure and meaning in what we purchase and support. In *The Spirituality and Giving Project*, thousands of people around North America were surveyed concerning their giving habits. Those who gave 10 percent or more of their income to God's work through the church consistently reported they felt great satisfaction from giving and that their lives had been blessed as a result. The blessings were not always financial, but they were always real. Figure out how much you give by dividing what you give by either 52 or 12 depending on whether you give weekly or monthly. You will get the percentage of your income you give to Faith Church. This may help you in thinking about your own giving to the church.

Take time for prayer and reflection. Below is a prayer to help you.

Prayer: Lord, help us handle money in creative, positive ways. Rather than being enslaved by financial decisions, set us free to live meaningful lives and to give generously. Amen.

Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing.

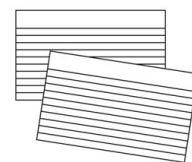


Keepsake **BOOK**

5. Use a binder ring or string yarn through the holes and tie to secure the cards together.
