Steps on the Journey

I have been reading and hearing about a number of "issues" in the past few days where people have tried to paint things in terms of right and wrong, black and white, legal and illegal. Where everything is one way or the other. In most of those instances there have been people involved. I find it difficult to believe that something is that cut and dried when people are involved. Usually when people are involved it depends on whether you know someone or love someone. Gray becomes the color of predominance, nothing is completely clear.

As I have been getting ready for Advent and Christmas this year I have been thinking about the reason for Christmas. God had been dealing the Israelites for hundred of years. Speaking through signs and prophets, giving warnings and loving the people. But they seemed to have difficulty hearing. They wanted things black and white, right and wrong, legal and illegal. They wanted their issue to be understood their way, not letting people get in the way. They had trouble seeing in shades of gray.

God decided that a change was needed. We refer to Jesus as "Immanuel", God with us. God came to be with us in flesh and blood to show us what it means to live a life of faith and connection to God. It began with a baby, a person with needs, a person that needed to grow. Every year we are reminded again that God is not about issues. God is about people. People caring for one another. People seeing beyond the issue to the person standing before them, the person in need of love and care. People willing to follow the way of Jesus.

This Christmas I hope you see the baby, that changed the perspective of the world to shades of gray because God felt people were more important.

May this season be filled with all the joy and sight that God wants for us.



Super Typhoon Haiyan, a category 5 storm—and perhaps the strongest

storm ever recorded— swept through the Philippines on Friday, November 8, causing extensive damage, displacing at least 670,000 people, and affecting a total of 11.3 million people. Initial estimated numbers of those killed and injured by the super storm are expected to climb. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is providing emergency food, water, and water purification tablets to 7,500 individuals (or 1,500 families) in Tacloban City in Leyte Province. The city was devastated by the typhoon and many there have no access to food, water, or medicine. Give generously to International Disaster Response, Advance #982450, to support UMCOR Philippines staff and volunteers as they work tirelessly to provide assistance to those in need. How Did our Garden Grow?



Faith United Methodist Church's third annual Garden for Neighbors, Inc. proved to be the most productive ever. On the sunny south side of the church, we grew amaranth, cabbages, cucumbers, onions, peas, peppers, pole beans, radishes, squash, and tomatoes. And we received additional contributions of apples, cucumbers, and plums grown by FUMC members.

We measured our output in four ways—pounds, meal units, total vegetables, and estimated retail value. Our garden produced 233 pounds of vegetables (163 pounds in 2012), 536 meal units (451 units in 2012), and 5,020 individual vegetables (3,109 in 2012)—with an estimated retail value of \$507 (new category this year).

The entire cost of the garden project was covered by designated memorial contributions.

Thanks to FUMC members who volunteered to make our 2013 garden a success—Bill and Lynn Bonkowske, Ruth Campion, Marti Kemp, Dawn and Gil Kinnunen, Chuck Martin, Carol Schuldt, Barb Schroeder, Jody Sielski, and Marsha Spatafore—plus international assistance from Debby Axness and Larry Struck, house guests of Gil and Dawn who have returned to their sailboat on the island of Curacao, off the coast of Venezuela.

A Tale of the Candy Cane

The account of the candy cane's origins circulates every Christmas season and is more likely a fun story than historical fact. No matter; tales often contain truth. This tasty treat can convey important elements of our Christian faith.



The stripes remind us of the heart of Christmas, our Savior, Jesus: white for his purity; red for his blood shed on the cross. The candy cane resembles the curved staffs of the shepherds — the first people to visit the Christ-Child and worship at the manger. And when the cane is turned upside down, it becomes a letter J, for "Jesus."

Indeed, Jesus turns our lives upside down and inverts our presumptions: A poor baby born in a stable becomes King of kings and Lord of lords; enemies aren't for hating but loving; blessings aren't for hoarding but sharing; the world works for war, but Jesus calls us to live in peace; receiving is better than giving; sinners are made saints; and death is conquered as God grants us eternal life.


Wreath

What you need:

- Paint (blue and green)
- Paint brush
- Embroidery hoop
- 24 wooden clothespins
- Scissors
- Craft foam (white, red and green)
- Glue
- 3 white feathers
- Floral wire (two pieces)

What you do:

- 1. Paint the hoop blue and the clothespins green. When dry, attach clothespins around the hoop.
- 2. Cut a dove shape (slightly wider than the hoop's diameter) out of white foam. Glue on feathers.
- 3. Pierce the beak with a scissors tip. Slide a piece of wire through the slit to make an olive branch.
- 4. From green foam, cut out two leaves. Attach them to each end of the wire.
- 5. From red foam, cut out the letters P E A C E. Glue them onto clothespins.
- 6. Place dove in center of hoop. Glue its head and tail to clothespins.
- 7. Attach wire to the back and hang up your wreath.
