September Money Pot Donations



Steps on the Journey

It is hard to believe it is time for the State Fair. Wasn't it Memorial Day last weekend? Time seems to be moving along faster than we like some times. There is always so much to get done. There was this project I was going to do this summer and that room I was going to clean before fall came. Sometimes I wonder if all we worry about is what we think we need to do. We forget to pause and listen to each other and to God.

A couple of weeks ago I was driving home from Columbus, Ohio. I was by myself with the radio. As I was driving I had time to think. What I began to think about was not all the things I needed to do, but the people I wanted to connect with. I thought about some of the events of my childhood, my thoughts turned to my spouse and my kids and my grandkids and I was reminded how blessed I was. I was also reminded that God remembers and knows each moment of my life. God knows our stories and invites us to know God's story.

I began to think about the people who have no one to think about them and remember them. The feeling of isolation can be overwhelming. It got me to think about *who I am I invited to listen to?* Whose story do I need to hear? Who do I need to remember? I know God knows their stories but sometimes we need a human ear.

This fall I hope we don't just rush from one thing to another. We don't feel like there is no time to get everything done. But we take the time to listen to each other's stories of their lives, we take the time to listen, to laugh together, to cry together and remember that sometimes we are God's ears. We are listening to one another and inviting each other into the grace that comes from being remembered by each other and by God.

Great Neighbors Duck Races

This event takes place during South Saint Paul's On the Road Again on Saturday, October 4 beginning at 10:00 a.m. Adopt a "duck," race against friends, or sponsor the event, and participate among a crowd of

15,000-20,000. Join Neighbors for a day of fun, duck races, food, and entertainment! All proceeds from the Duck Races will be used locally to support Neighbors, Inc. emergency and supportive programs.

It is a fun, festive event. In order to give the feel of the Mississippi River to the streets of South St. Paul we had to create our own river. Our amazing volunteers designed and built a 50-foot chute and a large duck-shaped holding tank. We fill the holding tank with water, line the ducks up at the top of the chute, open a water gate and the ducks are carried down our "river" by hundreds of gallons of water and the best wishes of onlookers. The ducks race down the chute, cross the line and come to rest in a "pond." The water drains out and the ducks are recaptured. Those that don't finish "in the money" retire for the day; the top finishers are set aside to prepare for the final race of the day.

You are invited to "Adopt a Duck" for just \$5. Each duck is entered into a preliminary race, or heat. The top finishers in each heat then go on to race in the finals. The heat winners earn a prize for their adopters, and

then the top three finishers in the final race earn huge prizes, as does the last duck to finish the final race, the Lazy Duck.

Riverbend Missions

The Riverbend Mission Team started out as a consortium of five United Methodist churches in a five-mile radius along a bend of the Mississippi River in St. Paul, Minnesota in response to a call from Rod Scofield to help rebuild the damages homes from Hurricane Katrina and bring God's love and hope to the hurting homeowners.

The first team was comprised of 15 members from five United Methodist churches: Salem and Mt. Bethel UMCs of Inver Grove Heights; the (then) First UMC of South St. Paul; Faith UMC of West St. Paul; and St. Paul's UMC of Mendota Heights.

We started our first mission recovery trip in Biloxi, Mississippi in April, 2006 working our way down the Mississippi coast twice a year to Slidell, Louisiana and New Orleans for a total of 8 years; 15 trips to the Gulf Coast and one trip to Crisfield, Maryland in October of 2013. I have been on all the trips except three, and what a journey it has been!

I've made so many new friends who have become like family. I have grown exponentially in my faith through preparing devotions, leading prayer, and sharing stories of faith with each other. I have been touched by the faith of the homeowners and their testimonies of faith that God is there for them, many of whose homes were devastated in Hurricane Katrina and were repaired, only to be hit again two years later by Hurricane Isaac. These people had had to wait patiently for help to come.

The Epworth Project led by Dale Kimball through the Aldersgate United Methodist Church in Slidell, Louisiana is one of the major organizations in LA still helping to repair homes and giving hope to the people in need. Dale is bringing a mission team to join our mission team in Crisfield, Maryland this October to work together. The dates are October 11-19, 2014; costs are \$300 per person, meals included. 

Start off the school year right by making this wipe-off board, which can help you remember important things.


What you need:

- Adult help
- 5" x 7" picture frame with glass (available at a dollar store)
- Lined notebook paper
- Scissors
- Low-heat glue gun
- Buttons, ribbon, stickers or foam shapes
- 1" piece of Velcro
- Erasable marker

What you do:

- 1. Using the cardboard insert or picture from the frame as a pattern, cut the notebook paper to fit the frame. Then insert it behind the glass.
- 2. Decorate the outside of the frame by gluing on buttons, ribbon, stickers or foam shapes.
- 3. Glue one side of the Velcro to the erasable pen and one side to the frame.

 Then attach the pen to the frame.
- 4. Place the board on your desk, dresser or kitchen counter. On the glass, write daily reminders about assignments and activities.
