
LENT BEGINS


MAUNDY THURSDAY April 2 • 7:00 p.m.

A Breakthrough Bread-Baking Experience

Steps on the Journey

This month we begin the season of Lent. Lent is the time of the year when we intentionally pause and examine our lives in light of our relationship with God. When have we made mistakes we need to take responsibility for, when have we forgotten to do or say something, when have we sinned and need forgiveness. All of this and more is part of our responsibility during Lent but all through the year.

Forgiveness is what puts us back in right relationship with God. God is always willing to forgive if we are willing to "repent" or acknowledge what we have done wrong. It seems for most of us admitting what we have done wrong is difficult. We want to be viewed as perfect, never making a mistake. But the truth is we make mistakes and sin on a regular basis. The good news is that God is always there willing to forgive us and help us move in the right direction. This is good news worth sharing. God loves us and forgives us and helps us move into relationship with God.

This Lent we are going to be looking at the various aspects of who God is through the "I Am" statements of God. On Wednesday evening we will introduce each of the aspects of God, on Sunday in worship will continue to examine each aspect of God and then during the adult Sunday School class we will go deeper into what the "I Am" statement means for us. I hope you will join us on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings for worship and class.

Lent is the journey that helps us get ready for Easter and the resurrection. Join us as we prepare our hearts and our lives for the next step on the journey.
