

MAKE A DIFFERENCE · LOVE OFFERING for MISSIONS ·

The Love Offering for Missions is collected within Minnesota United Methodist churches and delivered to annual conference session. It benefits international, national, and Minnesota missions. The conference Missions Promotion Team determines the annual recipients.

Donations to the 2014 Love Offering totaled \$121,000. Feed My Starving Children received 80% of that total, Project Ag-Grad received 10%, and Volunteers in Mission scholarships received 10%.

The 2015 Annual Conference theme is "God's Vision, Our Mission—Unleashed" and funds from this year's Love Offering will to go three projects that will help us answer God's call to heal a broken world. Here's a look at the 2015 Love Offering recipients:

Grace Children's Center in Vietnam

*Recipient of 60% of 2015 Love Offering



The United Methodist Church has strong and growing presence in Vietnam—and the Minnesota Conference recently formed a partnership with United Methodist leaders there. Many Vietnamese children come from broken homes and are in need of permanent or tempo-

rary care. The Love Offering will help expand Grace Children's Center in Ho Chi Minh City, which is currently providing education and daycare for about 20 of these children. The center now has a teacher who volunteers her time to educate first- and second-graders; the center's children also learn to grow fruit, raise chickens and ducks, and make hats—all of which are sold to help support the center. The Love Offering would pay off a \$10,000 loan for the building, provide a salary for the first-and second-grade teacher, and hire several more staff members: a third- and fourth-grade teacher, a health care worker, a cook, and a Korean language tutor (Vietnam is home to many Korean immigrants). Funds also will be used for sewing machines that children can use to learn to sew hats and other clothing. Our support will enable the center to make a difference in the lives of more children.

Church-School Partnership Grants

*Recipient of 30% of 2015 Love Offering

God calls us to be in ministry with children, and every United Methodist church in Minnesota is urged to develop a long-term partnership with a school in its com-

munity. The conference's Mission Promotion Team is launching a grant program that will provide funding to individual congregations to help them develop such partnerships. There are children in all Minnesota communities who lack



food, school supplies, winter clothes, books, and/or positive role models. After assessing needs that exist in their communities, churches can apply for funding to help them form an ongoing relationship with a school. There are many possibilities for partnerships. A few of them include supplying backpacks, clothing, or weekend meals; tutoring or mentoring students; opening up the church to school gatherings; offering parenting, ESL, or literacy classes; and praying for teachers and students.

Volunteers in Mission Scholarships

*Recipient of 10% of 2015 Love Offering



Mission trips change the lives of participants by giving them an opportunity to grow in their faith and gain a new perspective of the world. Through the United Methodist Church's Volunteers in Mission program, teams spend up to two weeks working on mission pro-

jects either domestically or abroad. Most teams from Minnesota are engaged in hands-on projects that build infrastructure to ensure that nutritional, medical, and educational programs in developing countries become sustainable and locally run. Team members pay their own way, and the Love Offering will help underwrite the cost for first-time participants.

Summer Reading Group

This summer we will have a reading group every other Monday beginning on June 8. We will be reading "Between the Dark and the Daylight: Embracing the Contradictions of Life" by Joan Chittisler.

Below is a description of the book:

There is a part of the soul that stirs at night, in the dark and soundless times of day, when our defenses are down and our daylight distractions no longer serve to protect us from ourselves," writes beloved author, Joan Chittister. "It's then, in the still of life, when we least expect it, that questions emerge from the damp murkiness of our inner underworld... These questions do not call for the discovery of data; they call for the contemplation of possibility."

In words as wise as they are inspiring, Between the Dark and the Daylight explores the concerns of modern life, of the overworked mind and hurting heart. These are the paradoxical—and often frustrating—moments when our lives feel at odds with everything around us.

Only by embracing the contradictions, Chittister contends, may we live well amid stress, withstand emotional storms, and satisfy our yearnings for something transcendent and real. By delving into the chaos, this book guides us through the questions that seemed easier to avoid and enlightens what has been out of focus. With her signature elegance, wit, and spirit, the best-selling author of The Gift of Years and Following the Path opens our eyes and hearts in these times of confusion. With simple and poignant meditations, Between the Dark and the Daylight reveals how we can better understand ourselves, one another, and God.



SPRING

Make this beautiful craft to remind you of God's gift of new life at springtime.



What you need:

- White 11" x 17" paper
- Acrylic paint (various spring colors, including green)
- Paintbrush
- Empty two-liter plastic bottle
- Paper plates
- Paper towels

What you do:

- 1. With the paper placed vertically, paint stems and leaves with green paint.
- Pour a different color of paint onto a paper plate.
 Then place the bottom of the bottle into the paint.
- 3. Using the bottle as a stamp, press it onto the paper to create a flower atop a green stem.
- 4. Repeat with different colors on different plates, cleaning the bottle each time, to create a beautiful spring bouquet.
