Church Lighting

This summer the church began undergoing a major project: changing all the lights in the building to a LED lighting system. This will improve the lighting throughout the building, especially in the sanctuary. It will also help make the building more energy efficient and reduce our electric bill. Please be patient as various part of the building will be "under construction" throughout the summer. The total project will cost approximately \$41,000. We will be financing the project primarily through a rebate from Xcel and a 0% interest loan through the Center for Energy and the Environment (CEE) to be paid off over the

How Does Our Garden Grow?

The Faith UMC Garden is producing vegetables at an impressive rate, well ahead of last year. Part of this year's increased output may be the result of adding straw bales to our

garden, but the weather may be an even more important factor—an almost perfect mix of sunshine and rain.

In July, we delivered 23 pounds of veggies to the Neighbors, Inc. Food Shelf. Cucumbers and herbs are the top performers so far. Last year, we had our best year for cucumbers with 122. This year, we've delivered 24 cucumbers in two weeks, 20% of last year's crop, with three months left in the growing season. Last year, we started growing herbs. So far this year, we've delivered nearly five times as many packages of herbs as we delivered in 2014, including basil, oregano, thyme, rosemary, and tarragon. And we've put together a one-page printed information sheet, Tips for Using Fresh Herbs in Preparing Food, to accompany our herbs. In the first week of August, we expect to add tomatoes, peppers, beans and squash. We're trying potatoes for the first time, and they may be ready by end of next month.



CONFERENCE CONNECTIONS

Minnesota Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church

All United Methodist churches are connected through shared mission and ministry and united in their efforts to grow in love of God and neighbor, reach new people, and heal a broken world. Check out these recent news tidbits from the Minnesota Annual Conference, which serves all 360 United Methodist churches in the state.

Bishop Ough calls for prayer for victims of church shooting: Following the horrific shooting at Mother Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in South Carolina last month, Bishop Bruce R. Ough called on Minnesota United Methodists to pray for the victims and the healing of the congregation. He also called on us to "renew our work to end racism, hatred, and the derogatory rhetoric that gives license to acts of violence" and to "seek peace with justice to affirm that all lives—every life—matters."

Cedar UMC hosts memorial service for stranger others turned away: Eight other churches said "no," but members of Cedar UMC opened their doors and their hearts to strangers who wanted to honor their friend Kim after she lost her battle with cancer. When Kim died, she had no living relatives and had used up all of her resources for treatment. Many church members volunteered to help with the service and even prepared a luncheon. It wasn't until the next day that they learned that Kim spent her formative years at Cedar UMC. Their actions had allowed her to come home.

Repentance toward Native Americans: "Can you see us?" Annual conference speaker, Rev. Anita Phillips, offered that as one of the four essential steps toward repentance for our Native American brothers and sisters. In reflecting on her words, Rev. Cindy Gregorson, director of ministries, said we've all experienced the difference between looking and really seeing. She pondered: "What would it be like to intentionally go through the day seeking to keep our eyes and heart open—to commit ourselves to seeing each person, without having to do anything about it or their situation in that moment—and as a first step, to just see them?"

Church-school partnership grants: God calls us to be in ministry with children, and every United Methodist church in Minnesota is urged to develop a long-term partnership with a school in its community. The conference's Mission Promotion Team launched a grant program that will provide funding to individual congregations to help them develop such partnerships. Learn more at www.minnesotaumc.org.

Flat Jesus keeps people connected to faith:

Members of Delano UMC made "Flat Jesus" laminated paper dolls that they're carrying around this summer to help them stay connected to their faith, and they are including Flat Jesus in photographs posted to social media with hashtag #FlatJesus. At the end of the summer, they'll give their Flat Jesus dolls to someone who's in need of Jesus' love and invite that person to come to church. Multi-church VBS for the community: Three churches in the small town of Eyota, including Faith UMC, offered a joint Vacation Bible School to people in the community of all ages. On vocation? Use GPS!

Many vacationers rely on a global positioning system to get them easily to a destination. But in every season of life, God sends us on vocation — following His call to both feed our passions and serve others. Our "calling," Frederick Buechner said, is "where [our] deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

But is there a GPS for vocation? It's not as detailed or predictive as we'd like. It doesn't name our destination at the outset, and it offers general instructions rather than specific directions. And we may end up "recalculating" our life route more often than our vehicle GPS recalculates our vacation route.

Even so, we travel in safety. This "GPS" might stand for God's Peace and Strength, or Gospel Promises Sustain, God Provides Salvation or Go! Proclaim! Serve! The GPS guiding our vocation speaks to us through Scripture, worship, trusted Christian friends, life events and the silence of our heart. Listening, we hear our Guide's calm voice and continue on vocation.
