Day of Service — October 18

Sunday, October 18 after worship we will have a day of service and then a potluck. Anniversary Offering

This year the anniversary offering will be used to pay off the lighting loan. This summer we have changed all the lights in the building to a LED lighting system. This has improved the lighting throughout the building especially in the sanctuary. We have added additional lighting to the sanctuary and new light fixtures in the Fellowship Hall. It will help make the building more energy efficient and reduce our electric bill. The total project cost of the project will be approximately \$41,000. We will receive a rebate from Xcel so our final bill will be approximately \$37,000 which we will be financing through a loan with the Center for Energy and the Environment (CEE) to be paid off over the next few years. The anniversary offering will help us make additional payments to pay the loan off faster.

Starting at 6:00 p.m. he will be with the Staff-Parish Relations Committee for their annual meeting with the D.S. Then at 7:00 p.m. Rev. Johnson will hold a church conference for the purpose of setting the pastor's compensation package and receiving a recommendation from the church council that we set up a church trust for receiving estate gifts from members of the congregation. After the church conference there will be a time of introduction and a chance for Dan to get to know us.

When Ebola was first reported in Liberia in the summer of 2014, many residents dismissed it as political propaganda or superstition.
