
LENT WORSHIP

During the month of March, Faith is joining people of good will from across the state to help alleviate hunger. Minnesota FoodShare's March Campaign is the largest food drive in the state, and congregations like ours are the heart of the campaign.

Last year the campaign raised more than 12 million pounds and dollars for Minnesota's food shelves. This year again Faith Church will be collecting both food and cash contributions throughout the month of March for Neighbors Inc. local food shelf.


