



#### **How Does Our Garden Grow?**

We're getting ready for the 2016 version of Faith UMC's Neighbors' Food Shelf Garden. Soon you'll see straw bales appear and the raised garden boxes fill with soil. Planting will begin in mid-May, when we are assured that frost is not in the forecast.

Last year, our garden produced the highest yield in its five years—260 pounds of veggies (beans, cucumbers, herbs, lettuce, peppers, potatoes, squash and tomatoes) with an estimated market value of \$1,125. This year's garden will include more tomatoes and herbs, which are very expensive to purchase in grocery stores.

And we'll increase the varieties of herbs and subsequently expand our printed information sheet, Tips for Using Fresh Herbs in Preparing Food, to include suggestions for each herb that we produce.

#### Founders' Day at Old Salem June 5

"The little white church" in Inver Grove Heights, when formed in 1857 as Salem Evangelical Church, was the state's first congregation of the Evangelical Association of North America. Parishioners met in another nearby location until the building was built in 1875.

Regular worship services there ended in 1910, but descendants of the church's founding families have kept traditions going. One of the annual rites, since 1999, is a Christmas Epiphany service held on the first Sunday in January. A Founders' Day service takes place on the first Sunday in June.

Please join us at this year's Founders' Day service on Sunday, June 5 at 3:00 p.m. Both Dennis and Gail Alexander will be present, and Dennis will offer the message.
