## Day of Service November 27

# Steps on the Journey

It was not the summer I had planned. I had projects that I was going to finish, a garden to care for, time to spend with family in various configurations and just enjoying some sun and fun. You know, taking that deep breath that we take each summer, as we change pace and relish each day.

My plans for summer changed radically. In June I thought I was simply fighting a virus, so I figured in a couple days things would be better. That was not the case. In July I knew I was having some teeth removed but it would be just 72 hours to recover. It was not the case. In August as I was getting ready for vacation my whole system crashed and I ended up in I.C.U. for two days and the hospital for 4 days. Not at all my plan.

But as I recover I am learning that there were lessons in the midst of all it.

First, I was reminded that God is with me regardless of what is happening, through all of this I am amazed at how peaceful I was. I knew I was not alone that there were arms holding me up. I was never alone.

Second, I was reminded of something I knew but take for granted too often. I have a wonderful family and close friends. My family sat in hospital rooms with me, others brought food to our house, others took me to appointments and helped me listen and others called to find out what was going on. It was an extraordinary experience to be cared for in this way.

Third, I am part of a wonderful faith community. People here at Faith have been gracious and helpful. You have made sure things happened that needed to happen. You have prayed for me, you have sent me notes and cared for me. I have heard from other people in other parishes I have served or Dennis has served who have let me know I am remembered in prayer. All of this has helped in the healing process.

Fourth, I am fortunate enough to have access to a wonderful medical establishment. I have a great family practice doctor who has studied, watched and is guiding a healing process for me. In the hospital I had caring, gentle nurses and staff who were there whenever I needed them. I am one of the lucky ones.

As we move into the fall, all I can say is thank you. Thank you for your generosity. Thank you for your caring. Thank you for your love. Thank you that God is with us at all the moments of our lives. So we take the next steps on our journey.

#### **Anniversary Offering**

This year the anniversary offering will go to help replace the floor in the Fellowship Hall.

#### Fellowship Hall Floor Project

You may have noticed the Fellowship floor, kitchen and back hallway is beginning to come up in places and looks terrible. Well, this fall the floor will be replaced. The new tile has been picked, the plans have been made and we need your help. First, to raise the money to pay for the floor (see article on the capital campaign) and second to move things. Saturday, October 22 at 10:00 a.m. we will be moving EVERYTHING out of the Fellowship Hall, kitchen and back hallway including the contents of all the closets. We will have the stoves moved by professionals, but everything else is our responsibility. We have a plan for storing the items around the church. The week of October 24 the old floor will be removed (this must be done carefully because the tile is made with asbestos). The week of October 31 and November 7 the new floor will be put down. Saturday, November 12 at 10:00 a.m. we will be returning everything to where it belongs. We will need your help to make this work. Come for an hour or more on either day. We will find something for you to do. Thank you.

#### **Capital Campaign**

#### What happens when a building get used? Soon

it needs repair. This year along with our 2017 Finance Campaign, we will be raising money for a new floor in the Fellowship Hall and for a new sound system in the sanctuary. We will need approximately \$30,000 for the two projects. A generous donor has come forward and will donate a dollar-for-dollar match for the floor and the sound system. So we need to raise \$15,000 (\$10,000 for the floor and \$5,000 for the sound system) before the end of the year, and it will be matched with \$15,000. If you would like to buy a piece of the floor, it figures out to \$10 per square foot. If you would like to buy a piece of the sound system, it will be \$10 per piece. We will have a chart up for us to keep track of how much we have raised. The floor will be going in the end of October through early November. The plan now is to have the new sound system in by Christmas. More information will come to you along with the finance campaign material in early October.

#### 2017 Finance Campaign "Rebuilding the House of God"

This year the theme of our 2017 Finance Campaign is "Rebuilding the House of God". It is based on a passage from Ezra 5: "We are the servants of the God of heaven and earth and we are rebuilding the house that was built many years ago." We are not only rebuilding our physical plant but we are looking at how we have done things in the past and figuring out new ways to be relationship with God, each other and the world. 2017 is a significant year for us and we continue to be the people of God here in West St. Paul but also beyond our borders. What is the gift you will be giving to help Faith Church continue its ministry? Be watching for more information in the mail. The first event on our new floor in the Fellowship Hall will be a catered meal in celebration of the gifts God has given us.

#### **Trust Fund**

In November, 2015 Faith United Methodist Church created a congregational trust for the purpose of receiving legacy gifts. (wills, estates, life insurance, etc.). The trust contains at this time three funds.

► The Heinemann Fund – a long standing fund here at Faith. The earnings from this account help pay **apportionments** to the Minnesota Annual Conference

► Legacy Fund – The earnings from this account would be used to help underwrite the ongoing ministry of the congregation. We have started this fund with a \$1,000 gift from the estate of Jean Marsh.

► Capital Facilities Fund – The earnings from this account would be used to pay for capital improvements to the property and building of Faith Church.

► The fourth option would be to add money to the "Faith Community & Education Foundation" - This fund is used for **community projects**. It is a separate 501.3c

We have received word that we will be receiving an estate gift that will be placed in these funds at the recommendation of the finance committee to the Board of Trustees of the church.

Please note: these funds are different than memorial money. Memorial money that is given is the responsibility of the memorial committee.
