Capital Campaign

This year along with our 2017 Finance Campaign, we have been raising money for a new floor in the Fellowship Hall and for a new sound system in the sanctuary. We need approximately \$30,000 for the two projects. A generous donor has come forward and will donate a dollar for dollar match for the floor and the sound system. We have raised \$22,000 with the matching so far. We need to raise the last \$8,000 (\$4,000 plus the \$4,000 match). The floor is in and we are busy using it. The sound system will hopefully be in by Christmas. If we do not raise the money the remainder we need to raise will go in the 2017 budget.

Disabilities are addressed by professional assessments from physicians, drug/alcohol counselors and/or mental health professionals.
