#### **How Does Our Garden Grow?**



We've come to the end of our 2017 gardening season. Two days before the first measurable snow, we delivered the last harvest—100 peppers and seven bags of herbs—to the Neighbors, Inc. food shelf. The garden itself is almost cleaned up for the winter, a few pole bean vines still clinging to the grid.

This year, our 7th annual Faith UMC Neighbors' Food Shelf Garden produced 452 pounds of vegetables. With the addition of beans, peppers, tomatoes and tomatillos from individual's "satellite" gardens, we delivered 463 pounds of vegetables to Neighbors. While our total poundage was down a little from last year, we set new records with 1,530 units or packages that exceeded \$1,400 in market value. We also set new records for numbers of green onions, herbs, peppers and green beans. Check the poster as you enter the church for photos and statistics. We look forward to a record-breaking 8th year in 2018.


