
### LENT BEGINS FEBRUARY 14

## Steps on the Journey

# "Prayer in Action is Love. Love in Action is Service." – Mother Teresa –

When I found the above quote it fit our Lenten message for this year. During Lent we are going to talk about how prayer supports our service. All of us talk about being of service to others and all of us talk about prayer. But I am not sure we always put the two together.

It is my understanding that prayer is our conversation/communication with God. It is a matter of listening as well as speaking. It is what undergirds our life as individuals as well as a community. It is God who gives us the strength, the insight, the wisdom to know where and who we are called to be and what we are called to do.

Service is the result of our prayers. It is how we show that we have been listening to God and it is what gives us strength when we are feeling weary, when answers do not come immediately or easily. Service is our prayers in action.

When the Renewal, Dream and Visioning teams were meeting I asked the teams to pray for this congregation and the team that we would have the wisdom to hear where God was calling us to go. I have continued that practice every evening as part of my daily prayers.

And now I am inviting everyone in the congregation to join together on *Wednesdays* at 6:16 p.m. to pray the following prayer. "Holy God, in these days help us to love you, to see each other, and to hear where you are calling us. In the name of the Christ who shows us the way. Let it be so. Amen." We will begin each Lenten worship with this prayer and if you cannot be with us I invite you to pray this prayer wherever you are, pause, pray and begin to make it part of your life.

I believe that God calls us to a life of service but we need the power of prayer and the direction of God to move us closer to God and to each other. I believe God has great plans for us if we continue to listen and be faithful to the God who leads us.

Come and join me, the adventure continues. It is one more step on our journey together.

### **Heinemann Fund**

The Heinemann Fund was established many years ago from money received the estate of the Heinemann family. The money was set aside to help provide income for paying the apportionments (connectional giving). In 2016 money was added to the Maurer estate. Today the base in the fund is \$50,000. In 2017 we were able to take market gains and interest income from the fund twice to pay for 3 months of apportionments (close to \$6,000). This fund is available to receive gifts at any time whether through an estate or a gift. The goal is to keep the principle intact and use only money from the market gains and the interest. #### Gifts of IRA Assets

Good news for taxpayers over the age of 70½. Congress has voted to make permanent the exclusion from income of up to \$100,000 per person, per year, for Individual Retirement Account (IRA) distributions which are given directly to charities. This money can be given to the church and you will receive a donation credit on your giving. For more information, contact your financial planner or Pastor Gail.



## The February money goes to the Center for Victims of Torture.

Center for Victims of Torture (CVT) rebuilds the lives and restores the hope of people who survive torture and war atrocities. CVT trains local mental health staff in the countries it serves. These counselors contribute to the long-term mental health needs in their countries. CVT provides technical assistance and training to torture survivor rehabilitation centers in the U.S. and around the world to strengthen each center's mental health services, organizational management and financial stability. CVT conducts research on and evaluation of rehabilitative care for survivors to determine the effects of torture and successful treatment approaches. CVT engages in public policy and public education initiatives to end torture and to increase government support for torture rehabilitation programs in the U.S. and abroad. CVT directs the New Tactics in Human Rights project and manages the HealTorture.org website.

## The March money goes for Minnesota Food share through Neighbors, Inc.

During the month of March, our congregation is joining people of good will from across the state to help alleviate hunger. Minnesota FoodShare's March Campaign is the largest food drive in the state, and congregations like ours are the heart of the campaign.

Last year the campaign raised more than 8 million dollars and 4.7 million pounds and dollars for Minnesota's food shelves.

This year our congregation will be collecting both food and cash contributions throughout the month of March for Neighbors Inc local food shelf.

Minnesota FoodShare is a program of the Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches and co-sponsored by:

- Jewish Community Relations Council of Minnesota and the Dakotas

We have set a congregational goal of raising 1,500 pounds during the month (\$1 equals one pound of food). If we reach our goal, there will be a special treat available one Sunday in April for everyone.


