How Does Our Garden Grow?

We've come to the end of our 2018 gardening season. Faith UMC's 8th annual Neighbors, Inc. Food Shelf Garden has been harvested. The garden area on the south side of the church is cleaned up for the winter, but we still have compost to distribute from 20 decomposed straw bales.

All tools, storage containers, and other "stuff" will be transferred to the storage shed by early

November. This year, our

garden produced 426 pounds of vegetables. With the addition of nine pounds of green beans, egg plants,

peppers, tomatoes, and zucchini from individual's "satellite" gardens, we delivered 435 pounds of vegetables to Neighbors. We set new records for herbs, green onions, squash, and tomatoes, green beans, cucumbers, and peppers (especially jalapenos) were down a little from last year. And we grew two kinds of spinach for the first time, including Malabar, a vitamin-rich climbing vine spinach. Our total poundage was down about 30 pounds from last year, but we set a record of \$1,500 for market value (average cost of purchasing vegetables from neighborhood grocery stores), exceeding last year's record of \$1,400. Here's to record-breaking 9th year in 2019. Thanks to all who helped with planting, tending, harvesting, and cleaning up. A complete list of names will appear in next month's issue. Check the poster in the church narthex for photos and statistics. Go to the Faith UMC website to see photos of this year's garden and gardeners.

Capital improvements Fund

We here at Faith have a capital improvement fund. We have used this fund to help pay for the floor in the Fellowship Hall, the new sound system, new windows and a new furnace in the parsonage. This fund can be added to any time. It is our emergency fund when repairs need to be made. It allows us to make the repairs as they are needed rather than having to wait until we raise or borrow the money. Right now the fund is less than \$10,000. If you would like to contribute to the fund please indicate that it is for the capital improvement fund.

UMC Market

If you shop online, you can go through the UMC Market portal/website, where a percentage of your purchase can be designated to Faith UMC. Signing up is free. Most churches are already listed on UMCmarket. When you go to UMCmarket.org, you will click on the get "Get Started" button. You will then simply sign up with your email, or through Facebook, find your church, and start shopping and donating. Giving couldn't be easier. Try it today! Last year we received a check in January because of the use of UMC Market!

Sanctuary Re-arrangement

We are in the process of rearranging the sanctuary. Over the summer the sanctuary task force recommended to the church council that we remove two pews in the back of the sanctuary and that the choir move onto the platform in the front of the sanctuary. We have removed the pews and are now working on moving the choir. In order for the choir to move onto the platform we need to add additional lighting. We have gotten estimates and are going with the company who changed the lighting in the church 3 years ago.

The additional lights and the electrical work will be between \$4,000 - \$5,000. We raised almost \$600 through the "Welcome Home" offering in September. If you would like to contribute to the lighting project, please make a contribution and mark it for "lighting". Thank you for your generosity.


