Steps on the Journey



One of the things I try to do every day is read a devotional or two. In the evening I read *The Upper Room.* In the morning I read two or three on-line blogs. I was struck the other day when I read the blog from David Haas on prayer. I would like to share that with you as we begin the new schedule.

Breathe in the Breath of God

It is far too common for you to be inflicted with spiritual asthma.

It seems often to crop up when you experience times of anxiety; when all of the assurances of God 's presence and activity in your life seem to, at times, almost instantly, are taken away from you like candy from a child.

These moments take you by the throat – or more so, by the heart, and seem to deprive you of the intimacy, you have with God.

When you have such moments of panic, of a manic sense of being afraid – these are the times that you need to listen to the voices of your spiritual guides and friends who are constantly encouraging you to simply, breathe.

It is in rediscovering this sense of breath, that prayer can really be real for you. It might be the case for some, but probably, for most people, and especially you – prayer will not find a concrete home in your heart by white-knuckling your way through a stern will or strict perseverance.

Prayer, this holy conversation that you -

and everyone on the spiritual walk –strive for, is a gift from God. God comes to you, and is still coming to you through a holy initiative, not through your own force of desire. No discipline, effort or intellectual practice can make God arrive in your life. Certainly, not in of itself.

Prayer is grace, a gift that comes freely and lavishly to you from God. And this gift is not difficult to access. It is easily within your reach.

Because of the gift of Jesus, God has entered into your life in a most intimate way. This gift is God made flesh and human, and is leading you to enter into a life that is filled with the Spirit – God 's holy breath – God 's open door to you to become so close to God, closer than you are to yourself.

Your anxiety and panic is a spiritual "shortness of breath" that can be transformed to a breathing pattern that is deep, centered, calming, and filled with assurance that God is very near, indeed.

God is already breathing in you. That part of the prayer is already there. You are being called, now, to breathe along.

The winner of each heat throughout the day will also receive a prize.

How Does Our Garden Grow?

The harvest has begun. We delivered the first fruits of our Neighbors, Inc. Food Shelf Garden during the first week of July. So far, we have delivered cucumbers, peppers, zucchini, bush beans, green onions, tomatoes, and several bags of herbs (parsley, sage, rosemary, and thyme—plus basil and oregano).

Last year, our garden produced 426 pounds of vegetables and set a record of \$1,500 for market value (average cost of vegetables from neighborhood grocery stores). Given the mix of sunshine, warm temperatures, and rain, we hope for another recordbreaking year in 2019.

Our garden is completely funded through memorial gifts and designated contributions.

Thanks to the volunteers who have helped water, weed, and harvest.

Red Bird Mission

Red Bird Mission, Inc. and Red Bird Clinic have been providing ministries in this region of the Appalachian Mountains since 1921. Today the need remains critical in this isolated, rural distressed area. Chronic poverty, lack of jobs, poor housing, and rugged mountainous terrain provide obstacles to a fuller life for the residents of this area. Red Bird Mission and Clinic strives to meet these needs through ministry in five areas: Education, Health and Wellness, Community Outreach, Economic Opportunity, and Community Housing Improvement.

The Education ministries are carried out through a Pre-K-12 school. Health and Wellness ministries are provided through medical and dental clinics providing quality health and dental care in an area that is chronically under served. The other three areas of ministries provide a wide variety of services to the residents of this area. Volunteers in mission service come and help with the refurbishment of homes, low-cost clothing and furniture is providing through the community store and local crafter's wares are marketed to a wide area through the craft marketing ministry.

Support for these ministries come from the churches and individuals across the nation. Over the years the Mission has enjoyed wide support in the United Methodist Church as well as other denominations. In recent years we have seen a decline in the support Red Bird is receiving. They are currently facing a financial crisis that is making it difficult to continue all the areas of ministry they provide. Without more funding, we will have to reduce the level of ministry provided to this community.
