## *Greetings,*

It is said that “because things are the way they are, things will not stay the way they are” (Bertold Brecht, German poet). Our lives are filled with change, even at their most stable. If there’s anything we can say about COVID, it is certainly not the epitome of stability. Life has changed so much in the past six months, and I suspect it will continue to change as we live through this global pandemic.

One of the changes we have seen in the past few months is the pausing of in-person worship in our sanctuary. We now worship Sunday mornings from the comfort of our own homes (or in some cases porches). Starting this month, we will also begin to offer children and youth Sunday School, and a quilting bible study on the women of the Bible over Zoom. I am so glad that we live in an age of technology that allows us to

continue to connect and communicate even when we are not in the same physical space.

At the same time, I know that the virtual connection does not completely fulfill the need we have of being in relationship with one another. We have not had a monthly food drive for Neighbors in many months, and being out of the building makes it easy to forget about the Mission Well, not to mention the conversations, hugs and handshakes we have not had. It is hard to be spread apart in this time. As a result, we are going to start doing a monthly supply parade.

The supply parade will have a few different functions. First, for the church office to distribute information like Sunday School or Bible Study materials, or a new church directory. Secondly, it will be a time for you to bring things that you need to deliver to the church, such as Mission Well offerings, regular tithes, food

donations for Neighbors, Inc., etc. Finally, it will be a time for you to see Pastor Marianne and maybe others just to say hi. Even if you don’t have anything to drop off or pick up in the September parade, I invite you to participate anyway. Stop by and celebrate the joy of being a community of faith in this place.

I know that church is different than it once was. Change is difficult, and yet I trust that God is with us in the midst of the change, helping us to find our way. “Because of the way things are, we know that they will not stay the way they are.” Yet, we know that God is with us even in the midst of the changing seasons. In that we put our trust, and so we can adapt the way we live out our lives of faith even when everything feels so very different.

## Reopening Taskforce Update

On August 28th, the Reopening Taskforce met to define when we believe it will be safe to gather together for in-person worship in the sanctuary. Given unpredictability of COVID, we are going to use the same data prepared by the Department of Health for the school systems. When the 14 Day COVID Case Rate for Dakota, Ramsey, Hennepin, Washington and Anoka counties is below 10 for two weeks, we will make preparations to worship in person in the sanctuary. You can find that data on the Department of Health's website here: <https://www.health.state.mn.us/diseases/coronavirus/stats/wschooll.pdf>. The chart is updated every Thursday morning. We decided to use this metric because it is the defining line across the state for all students to be in full in-person instruction. If the Department of Health believes it is safe for all of our students to be in school, we believe we can safely gather for worship. In the meantime, we will continue to improve the Zoom worship experience through widening our circle of participation. Sunday School will begin through

Zoom and there will be a renewed emphasis on small group gatherings in order to continue to be in community and ministry with one another. The taskforce will gather again when the 14 Day COVID rate is between 12 and 15 to finalize adaptations and safety protocols for returning to in person worship in the sanctuary. ## How Does Our Garden Grow?

At the end of August, we completed our eighth week of harvesting vegetables from our food shelf garden to Neighbors, Inc.—herbs, beans, cucumbers, onions, peppers, squash, and tomatoes. So far, we've picked more than 600 tomatoes of all sizes and colors and nearly 1,200 green beans. Our 2020 totals so far are 140 pounds of vegetables with a market value of \$570.

Last year, the church garden plus "satellite" gardens from members and friends produced nearly 500 pounds of vegetables with a market value exceeding \$1,500 (based on average cost of vegetables from neighborhood grocery stores).

Our garden is completely funded through memorial gifts and designated contributions. We're especially grateful for the help of Anna and Hannah, our teen-age neighbors, who have become enthusiastic gardeners this summer.

## Women of the Bible Crafting Bible Study

## A BUSHEL OF BOOKS



Design a handy bag to tote your books this fall.

### What you need:

- Plain canvas bag
- Cardboard scrap
- Acrylic paints (2 colors)
- 2 small paper plates
- Apple
- Knife (and adult help)
- Foam brush
- Scrap paper



### What you do:

1. Lay the bag flat on a table, and place cardboard inside for protection.
2. Pour a paint dollop on each plate.
3. Slice the apple in half, keeping the core intact.
4. Brush a thin layer of paint on the cut side of an apple half. Practice making stamps on scrap paper. Use the other color on the other apple half.
5. Paint and stamp the bag with your final design. When dry, remove the cardboard.
6. Use the bag for school and Sunday school. Happy reading!
