Greetings,

This autumn I did something that I haven't done in a while: went back to school. During the 2021-2022 appointment year, I am participating in a certificate program through Dakota Wesleyan University and sponsored by the Minnesota Annual Conference to help train clergy in how to lead non-profit organizations (aka churches). My classes include financial stewardship, stewarding human resources, stewarding vision and stewarding community, and are designed to help me be a better leader. As I write this, I am about 3/4 of the way through Financial Stewardship, which has been challenging, but good.

In addition to the coursework, the program also has an applied project component: each semester, with the help of a clergy coach, I am to complete a project incorporating the lessons learned in class into the life of the church to solve an identified problem or increase our capacity for ministry. This semester, with the help of my coach and the work of a dedicated team of church leaders,

I am undertaking the task of looking at our vision, mission and goals for ministry in the church, with particular attention to the financial health and sustainability of the church. That's a lot of fancy words and technical jargon to say that I want for all of us together to name our reason for gathering as a community of faith, look at how we live out God's love in the world and do our best to manage our money in such a way that allows us to do those things.

The work for this project has already begun, but it cannot be completed by just me, or even me and a small group of dedicated leaders. In order to continue on our next steps, I am inviting anyone interested to join in the conversation on October 2 from 9am—3pm at the church. During that time, we will look at who we are, what makes Faith UMC in West St Paul unique and how we might move into the future together. Some of you may remember one, two, or even more times when the congregation has undertaken the work of creating mission and/or vision statements. This project

does not erase that work, but continues it into the next generation. One of the things that leadership experts remind us is that the mission and vision of organizations must periodically be looked at, otherwise we lose focus. Our goal in meeting is not to find the perfect wording for a vision statement, but to lay out a plan for ministry in the next period of time and discuss how that plan intersects with our financial systems in the church.

If you are interested in participating in the church planning meeting, please let me know by September 29th so that I can plan materials (including lunch) accordingly. I will plan to update the whole congregation with our progress throughout the project, and beyond as we continue to live out our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world and vision of being grounded in Christ; open to making a difference—together.

COVID Update

It may not come as a surprise to you to know that I am completely over this whole pandemic thing. We can go on to living in a post-pandemic world any minute as far as I'm concerned. Unfortunately, we're not quite there yet. So, I want to start this update by saying I greatly appreciate the dedication, flexibility and grace you all are demonstrating in the midst of ever-changing less-than-ideal situations.

When the Reopening Taskforce last met to discuss our continued efforts to adapt in the midst of the pandemic, it was determined that for the time we should follow the recommendations put forth by the Annual Conference. In brief, due to the current surge of the Delta variant, which has brought an increase in pretty much every metric, we are encouraging everyone to wear a mask at all times in the building, practice social distancing during worship and in meetings, and we are not singing during worship, nor are we eating in the building as a part of fellowship time. Hopefully, this phase will not last too long, and we can go back to singing together in worship again soon.

How Does Our Garden Grow?

Our 11th annual Neighbors, Inc. Food Shelf Garden completed its 14th week of harvest at the end of the last full week of September—about 75% of the way through the harvest season. In straw bales and raised soil beds, carts, and pots (plus “satellite” gardens of members and friends), we've picked



and/or delivered beans, cucumbers, peppers, squash, green onions, tomatoes, and lots of herbs— 525 pounds and \$2,075 in market value, based on average cost of vegetables from neighborhood grocery stores (last year—455 pounds with a market value of \$1,760).

Our garden is completely funded through memorial gifts and designated contributions.

Worship Update

Worship is one of the most recognizable ways that we demonstrate our life of faith. Each week we learn something new as we gather as a community of faith in person and online to celebrate the love of God in our midst. Join us every Sunday either in person or on Zoom at 9:30am.

Here are some notable things about the worship services in October and November:

October 3 is World Communion Sunday. We will celebrate communion, as well as continue our Belief in Books study looking at *Old Turtle* and Genesis 1.

October 10 is the conclusion of our Belief in Books series. The book is *The Dandelion Seed*, which is paired with Matthew 28:16-20. We will also be collecting our anniversary offering as we look at how our gifts are seeds for the future.

October 17 begins our Spooky Church sermon series where we will look at scriptures with Halloween themes. We start by looking at Skeletons, as found in Ezekiel 37.

October 24 our worship will look at witches and ghosts, as found in 1 Samuel 28, as we continue Spooky Church.

October 31 concludes Spooky Church as we go Trick-or-Treating with Jacob and Esau in Genesis 27.

November 7 in addition to celebrating communion and honoring our saints, we will start looking at John Wesley's three simple rules for money. The first rule, earn all you can, looks at finances through the lens of Jesus' teachings.

November 14 we will look at John Wesley's second rule for money: save all you can.

November 21 concludes our look at John Wesley's rules for money with give all you can.

November 28 kicks off our celebration of Advent as we begin to make preparations for the coming of the Christ-child.
